Meals

Hosts serve three meals daily: breakfast, a packed lunch and dinner. They include the four basic food groups: protein (meat, fish), carbohydrates (bread, pasta, rice), dairy products (milk, cheese, eggs), fruit and vegetables.

BREAKFAST

Juice and/or milk, cereal and/or muffins, toast/bagels.

LUNCH

Sandwich (ex. sliced turkey, cheese, tomato and lettuce), fruit and vegetables (ex. apple, orange, banana, carrot and celery sticks) and juice box.

DINNER

Sample meal may include pasta, salad, bread and cheese, dessert and/or fruit (optional).

Roast chicken and potatoes, cooked vegetables, dessert and/or fruit (optional).

DIETARY REQUIREMENTS

If students require a vegetarian diet EC must be informed of this prior to a student's arrival.

Laundry facilities are available to the student.

MEDICAL

EC must be advised upon booking of any medical conditions, allergies or medication that needs to be administered to students.

Students are covered by medical insurance to a maximum \$2,000,000 CDN

Learning Centre

Lessons are held at EC Vancouver, a bright, newly renovated school in downtown Vancouver. The school is located in a landmark building in the centre of this incredibly picturesque city, with large, airy classrooms offering lots of natural light.

- Students attending the Classic Vancouver programme will attend a General English course - 20 lessons (45 mins each) per week. The course will help improve English language skills by focusing on the key areas: reading, writing, speaking and listening. A strong focus is placed on speech and using the language confidently and fluently.
- International classes
- Activities are led by and closely supervised by EC Monitors

Academic Rules

- Attendance in class is required. If students are sick they must notify the school immediately.
- · Punctuality is required
- All classes begin promptly at 9.00am
- English is the only language spoken at school and in the classes
- Students must respect their fellow students' cultural and ethnic background. Intolerance, harassment or discrimination is not tolerated.
- Food and drink is not permitted in the classroom or in the computer room.



Students should arrive at EC Vancouver by 8.30 am to begin testing and their first day information session. First day includes evaluation, registration and orientation and an activity. Students begin their programme on the first day.

Students are to bring their passport and flight ticket to school on the first day.

MINIMUM COURSE DURATION

1 week

MAXIMUM CLASS SIZE

15 students

ATTENDANCE

All students must attend classes on a daily basis unless they are genuinely indisposed (due to illness, for example). Attendance to all pre-paid and afternoon activities is required.

EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS

Educational materials are provided. Students should bring their own notepaper and pens.

Welfare, Rules and Disciplinary Action

CURFEW TIMES

- Standard curfew time is 10 pm on weeknights
- Standard curfew time is 11 pm on weekends
- A curfew form is requested to be signed by the parents and the students.

ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION

The legal drinking age in British Columbia is 19 years. It is illegal for all students attending this course to consume alcohol, have someone buy alcohol on their behalf or visit bars/clubs.

DRUGS

Using drugs, being under the influence of drugs or possessing drugs is illegal. Under no circumstances should students use, possess or be under the influence of drugs.

SMOKING

The legal age to buy tobacco is 19 years. It is illegal to buy tobacco or have someone buy tobacco on the student's behalf if they are under the legal smoking age.

False ID

Being in possession of false identification is illegal in Canada.

Course Certificate

Students must attend all lessons and organised activities in order to receive their End of Course Certificate

Parent's Permission

The student's parents must sign a code of conduct document with the student. Parents sign for permission to leave homestay and liability issues.

ACCOMMODATION RULES

- The student must call their homestay by 4.30pm if they are going to be late for dinner or if they are not going to join their homestay for dinner
- · No overnight guests
- A phone card must be used for all long distance phone calls
- Students should lock the door when leaving the homestay
- Students must keep their room clean and tidy at all times
- Students must advise their homestay hosts of where they are going and at what time they will be home
- Homestay hosts set times for students to be home during the week and weekends. Students must obey and respect these times

CUSTOMER COMPLAINTS

At EC, we endeavour to provide our students with the highest possible level of service. If, however, a student is unsatisfied with any aspect of their programme with EC, we ask that they inform us immediately. Most problems are small and can be quickly resolved by our staff members. During the first week of school, all students are given an Initial Course Evaluation form, in which they are asked to evaluate various aspects of their stay, such as tuition, accommodation and leisure. The form also allows students the opportunity to bring to our attention anything that is not to their satisfaction should they feel unable to speak to us directly. Solutions to any issues will be provided and all necessary parties will be notified when applicable. Students are also requested to complete an End of Course Evaluation form at the end of their stay such that they have the opportunity to provide EC with general feedback before returning to their home country.

EXPULSION

Failure to follow any of the above rules will result in immediate expulsion from the TLA programme with no refund. Students' parents will be notified immediately and sent home at their own expense. Depending on the severity of the situation, breaking any of the above rules may result in a monetary fine, arrest, jail sentence or deportation by the Canadian police.
